Street Pastors / Prayer Pastors

The group does some really excellent work on the streets of Bromsgrove on Friday nights, helping to protect the vulnerable and sometimes taking the opportunity to share something of the Christian faith. The taxis, door staff and police really appreciate the difference that Street Pastors have made in the last seven years providing a non-judgmental calming presence.

The group desperately needs both Street Pastors who patrol armed with flip flops and lollipops, and Prayer Pastors who stay in the warm, next to a kettle and a bible.

My daughters sometimes go clubbing with friends and I'd like to think that if they were being hassled by a guy, perhaps after they had had a drink too many, there would be a Street Pastor to help them dump the guy, drink some water, swap their heels for flip flops, and get them into a taxi and back home safely.

But for Bromsgrove, all this could end soon.

On several occasions recently no patrol has been possible because of a shortage of volunteers.

Could you help?

The patrols usually last from 10 pm to 4 am and if you could possibly spare even a few hours to join us on the street or in prayer, it could make the difference between a patrol being cancelled or stepping out. Jan Martin is a Street Pastor and Martin Tingle is a Prayer Pastor. Please speak to either of them about either role.

Refujuice

You are now aware that Refugee families from Syria are now living in the Bromsgrove and Redditch areas. As a way of making an income to help support themselves, they have been given the opportunity to make their own apple juice to sell to the public. They do this by gleaning apples from the large commercial orchards in Gloucestershire. The apples are then taken to Pershore Agricultural College, where they are made into apple juice, under supervision from the College and under the strictest rules for food production.

The resulting juice is top quality and made to last two years. It costs £3.00 per bottle (less than a bottle of wine) and 100% of the profit goes to support the local Refugee families and the Refugee camps in Europe.

It has been agreed that we can sell this delicious healthy juice on the first Sunday of the month - our Fair Trade Sunday.

I will have some bottles for sale on Sunday 5th May so, as you buy your Fair Trade food, please also treat yourself to Refujuice. I have put a poster on the noticeboard.

Food Safety

The Church Council has taken advice from the Food Standards Agency. We are still able to provide home-made cakes and food for events we organise on the premises. There are 14 recognised food allergens, some of which you might find surprising. Therefore all ingredients in home-made food that is brought to the church premises must be noted and a form should be filled in. You can get a copy of a leaflet about the allergens from the coffee bar. There is also a form with tick-boxes to fill in if you are likely to bring food to the premises. The tick-boxes highlight which allergens might be in the food so that those who have allergies can act accordingly.

You can make a photocopy of the ingredients in a recipe or bring the recipe books to photocopy at church. You can also write down the ingredients (including any tinned or dried goods you might mix in). Please ask someone at the coffee bar if you would like a leaflet and a form. Thank you.
