
#### **ECO** church information & top tips

As a developing Eco Church we talk about "Carbon footprint" (7) but what does it mean and how can we reduce ours at home? It's made up by everything we do that generates greenhouse gases into the atmosphere. So how can we reduce our own? Big savers are driving/flying less, having one meat free day a week and planting trees. Taking shorter showers, lowering the heating thermostat, washing clothes at 30°c or below, unplugging electrical devices not in use and changing to LED light bulbs are medium savers. Smaller ones BUT with big impact are shopping locally, keeping reusable bags handy at all times, and saying no to single use cutlery and packaging.

### **Service for Christian Unity**

This year we are hosting the Service for Christian Unity on the 19th of January at 6 pm. This service is for all the churches and Christian communities in the village which observe the Week of Prayer together through a single common service, an order for an ecumenical worship service. This year the prayers and reflections for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity were prepared by the brothers and sisters of the monastic community of Bose in northern Italy.

The theme for this year is "Do you believe this?" (John 11:26). The preacher is Baptist Minister Rev. Simon Gudger.
